SHORT TERM COURSE ON MODEL YOUTH PARLIAMENT

Introduction

Youth Parliament was a Powerful Dialogue on Democracy with the vision to Engage & Enlighten the Youth of the Country to understand Politics & the Functioning of Parliament.

Youth Parliament means a platform for the youth to speak up, participate in the policy direction and have an impact on the growth agenda of the country. It encourages young people to express themselves in an organised manner and enable them to emerge as promising future leaders. The Fourth All India Whips' Conference, held in Bombay in 1962, conceived the idea of encouraging the Youth Parliament in educational institutions in order to further strengthening of democracy.

The Model Youth Parliament Programs lay a bridge between youth, like-minded people working for society, and government by providing a common platform and foster for a healthy discussion on political reforms, parliamentary activities, policymaking, education, and employment.

What is Youth Parliament?

- 1. Citizens must possess certain competencies to participate in the democratic functioning of our civic and political institutions actively and meaningfully.
- 2. As a result, a suitable programme to prepare youth for their role as citizens in a democracy is required.
- 3. Citizenship education cannot be taught solely by providing students with facts.
- 4. We must consider not only developing competencies in students, but also influencing their attitudes, which are critical for running the country's democracy on the right lines.
- 5. The Youth Parliament is a program that makes effective use of group discussion and roleplaying techniques.
- 6. The involvement of young leaders in parliamentary activities is beneficial to the country, but their active participation depends on their familiarity with the procedure.
- 7. Even political parties have recognized the importance of training and orienting their young legislators.
- 8. Given this development, the Youth Parliament scheme should go a long way towards preparing future legislators for their roles in the country's parliament and state legislatures.

Objectives of the Course

The objectives of the Model Youth Parliament are:

- 1. To familiarise the younger generations with the customs and processes of Parliament.
- 2. To instil the spirit of discipline and tolerance in the hearts of young people; and
- 3. To instil core democratic ideals in the student body and to provide them with a comprehensive understanding of how democratic institutions work.

- 4. The Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs provides states with the required training and incentive to implement the plan.
- 5. To develop in students an insight into the working parliament.
- 6. To make students consider public issues and form their opinion on them.
- 7. To train students in the technique of group discussion.
- 8. To develop in students an ability to arrive at decision after group discussion.
- 9. To develop respect and tolerance for the views of others.
- 10. To make students aware of various problems faced by our society and the country.
- 11. To create in students the quality of leadership. Understand the common man's point of view and express it in an articulated manner.

Significance of the Course

- 1. To create a set of youngsters who have an idea of the parliament, the best way is to make them sit in that environment.
- 2. It is a platform to discuss the national issue on a large scale in a proper forum and in front of the experienced moderators.
- 3. It brings the like-minded youngsters on the same platform and offers a chance for the creation of a community to discuss and come up with the possible solutions.

Course Outcomes

- 1. It helps to familiarise the younger generations with Parliament's practices and procedures.
- 2. It helps to instil the spirit of discipline and tolerance in the minds of youth.
- 3. It instils in the student community the basic values of democracy and enable them to acquire a proper perspective on the functioning of democratic institutions.
- 4. It provides a platform for young people to articulate specific youth-related issues and concerns, but most importantly, to share their perspectives on national-level issues.
- 5. It provides a forum for them to express their views, allowing them to conduct an in-depth analysis of the society in which we live.
- 6. Governance necessitates an active citizenry and given that youth aged 15 to 29 account for 27.5 percent of the population, it is deemed critical to creating more opportunities and mechanisms for civic engagement of youth.
- 7. The Youth Parliament is one of these activities through which we can teach real citizenship.
- 8. The Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs provides states with the necessary training and encouragement to implement the scheme.


